There is only one chromatic scale since all twelve notes are included. Start scale on your lowest note.

Practice scales two octaves if possible. If not, play an octave and a fifth (up to fifth note of scale.)

Scales can be practiced in order on page or ideally in chromatic order (example: C Major, C# Major, D Major...)

Play scales with even tempo with quarter or eighth note value.
